

Employment Opportunities

Florence County Land Conservation Department is hiring grant-based, summer Limited Term Employment (LTE) positions. Positions will run from May 11, 2017 to September 5, 2017. All positions require working weekends, holidays, and non-standard hours. Applicants must have a willingness to learn, along with a friendly and helpful personality that promotes a positive respectful experience for the public and co-workers while demonstrating a genuine interest in preserving water quality. Seasonal staff will follow Florence County's Personnel Policy requirements. Applicants must possess a valid driver's license, have transportation, and be willing to work at remote sites. Most positions require the safe operation of hot-water pressure washers. A knowledge of Aquatic Invasive Species is helpful, but not required. **All positions are subject to grant requirements, and are classified LTE with no benefits.** Mandatory training for all positions will be provided.

Watercraft Inspector: A limited number of full (400 hour) and part-time (200 hour) positions as Clean Boats, Clean Waters (CBCW) Watercraft Inspectors. Successful applicants will follow Wisconsin's CBCW protocols to assist the public with prevention, education, and techniques aimed at slowing the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species. This position requires work outdoors, professional interaction with the public, simple interviewing, and careful record keeping. **Wages:** \$11.00-\$12.00/hour.

AIS Team Leader: One position (440 hours). The successful applicant will assist LCD staff in meeting grant requirements. Duties include, but are not limited to water quality monitoring, Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) inspection and reduction efforts, participating in local AIS educational activities, regional events, partnerships and statewide initiatives; conducting watercraft inspections, lake monitoring, mapping, and plant surveys, along with data collection. This position requires work outdoors, careful record keeping, and familiarity with small vessel operations. A background or education in environmental or water sciences beneficial. **Wages:** \$11.00-\$12.00/hour.

AIS Coordinator: One full time (640 hour) position. The successful applicant will lead the effort in reaching active grant project goals. Duties include, but are not limited to, oversight of the CBCW program including scheduling, payroll, supervision of CBCW staff, and conducting watercraft inspections. Duties also include water quality monitoring, AIS inspection and reduction efforts, participating in local AIS educational activities, regional events, partnerships and statewide initiatives; conducting watercraft inspections, lake monitoring, mapping, and plant surveys, along with data collection and entry. A background or education in environmental or water sciences, and/or computer skills beneficial. A familiarity with small vessel operations helpful. This position is both in office and the field. Based on grant requirements and restrictions this position may be extended to December 31, 2017. **Wages:** \$14.60/hour.
